Online or blended learning

- Be aware of any practical activities that have to be delivered face to face e.g. some of the construction units
- If they have to be practical activities, do the learners have the facilities to be assessed at home?
- How can you assess practical elements when delivering online? Video or audio recordings, annotated photographs, storyboards and product evidence could be used.
- Can you limit face to face access and deliver blended learning?
- Could you deliver core units online and specialist units in smaller groups face to face if necessary?



Blended approach

Break larger groups down:

- Face to face sessions for practical units e.g. Bricklaying Skills
- Online delivery if applicable for other groups e.g. Introduction to Self Employment or Communication Skills for Work
