




Figure 1. The Essential Digital Skills framework, published in 2022

There are 26 Life tasks and 20 Work tasks, split across five skill areas:

Communicating, Handling Information and Content, Transacting, Problem Solving and Being Safe and Legal Online.

An individual needs to perform at least one task within each of the five Life and Work skill areas, without assistance, to achieve Life or Work EDS.

Work EDS

I can independently perform at least

one task within each Work skill area

Life EDS

I can independently perform at least one task within each Life skill area



The Foundation Level


I can independently perform all eight tasks



Anyone can now be measured for Work EDS (excluding retirees). To be counted as able to do a task, an individual may say they can complete a task at work, but might not necessarily need to put this into practice all the time.

An additional task has been added to ensure an online safety element is incorporated within the most basic digital tasks.





Figure 10. 'You have said that you have not used the Internet in the last 3 months. Please choose from the following options to say why you have not', 2022 n=125



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



Transacting online Respondents continue to be **least likely** to say that their learners have benefited from this skill:

54% o attendance to lessons

55% o achievement rates have improved a great deal/considerably.

Essential Digital Skills CPD programme

The Department for Education (DfE) has introduced a new <u>Essential Digital Skills (EDS) framework</u> and associated national standards, which set out essential digital skills for life and work.

Young people aged 16-19 and adults with no or low digital skills are now entitled to take EDS qualifications free of charge, in line with existing entitlements for English and maths.

The new standards cover five areas:

- Using devices and handling information using devices, finding and evaluating information, managing and storing information, identifying and solving technical problems
- Creating and editing creating and editing documents and digital media, processing numerical data
- Communicating communicating, sharing and managing traceable online activities
- Transacting using online services, buying securely online
- Being safe and responsible online protecting privacy and data, being responsible online, digital wellbeing.





Teaching and Learning Resources EDSQ and DFSQ





Resources

Purpose

Support delivery of the DFSQ subject content at Entry level 3 and Level 1

Show the depth and breadth of knowledge and skills required

Suggest different approaches to the delivery

Include activities for face-to-face, remote delivery, and activities to support independent learning

Signposting to online content (including. tutorials, demonstrations, videos, interactive activities and quizzes.)

Prepare learners for the mock /live assessment on Surpass



Resources

Each resource provides guidance on tutor delivery

Followed by learner activities to reinforce learning

Some activities can be carried out in pairs/groups of learners

With follow up discussions/peer checks/show-and-tell

Links to online tutorials cover

Microsoft, Google and Mac platforms and allow learners to practise skills at their own pace

Activities foster independent learning

Support learners who want to progress quickly and learn additional skills

Activities may be contextualised to curriculum areas.

E.g., searching for and comparing building suppliers, health and beauty products

Quizzes, formative assessments and checklists

Can be used to measure learners' progress in preparation for mock and live assessments













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
